

Why is Chevron attacking Marilyn?

Why is the oil giant so afraid of Marilyn?

Because I want to ensure that the Chevron refinery behaves as a responsible neighbor: paying its fair share of taxes, minimizing pollution and preventing toxic fires

Because for 100 years, Chevron has dominated local politics in Richmond, and I stand for democracy.

Because I am an independent candidate; I do not accept money from Chevron or any other corporation

Because I believe local government has a responsibility to prioritize the health and well-being of all residents over the desire of super-rich corporate elites to acquire more wealth

Because I am motivated by faith in people and love for the community.

I challenge Chevron to turn its full attention to operating its refinery so that Richmond residents are no longer endangered by toxic fires and pollution.

Chevron's latest smear: Marilyn is an irrational 9-11 conspiracy theorist.

Here is the truth : On 9/11, my daughter, who was 18 at the time, lived a few blocks from the World Trade Center. Thankfully, she survived. Because her life was put at such great risk, I took a keen interest in following all the available information about the events of that day. Life has taught me not to accept "official" explanations without checking the evidence.

I have always paid my taxes



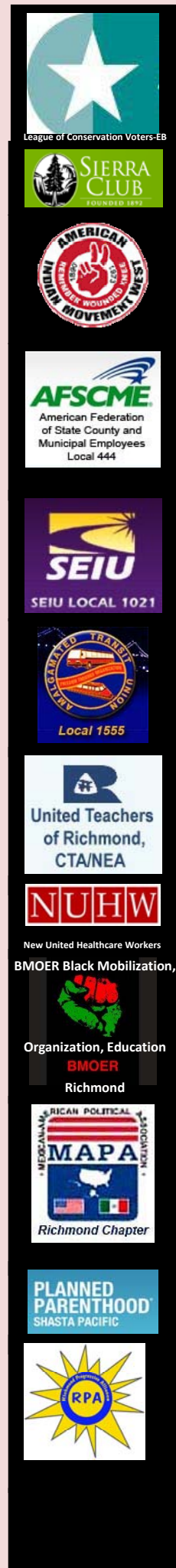
I have always paid my local, state, and federal taxes. I do not owe a penny in back taxes. I fully support fair taxation as a way to pay for public services.

In 2006 and 2007 as a symbolic gesture to protest Bush's illegal war on Iraq, **I paid my federal taxes through a protest route, known as war tax resistance:** I placed the full amount in a bank account to await the inevitable IRS collection process, informing my **Congressman George Miller** of what I was doing and why.

I'm proud of my acts of peaceful resistance to the immoral and illegal war of the Bush government, financed with our taxes, which should instead have gone to jobs programs to build healthy communities and eliminate poverty.

To further make this point I also donated (2006) three times the amount of my tax liability to worthy educational, social services and arts organizations in Richmond and beyond. These include the East Bay Center for the Performing Arts, National Institute for Art and Disability, Girls, Inc., EcoVillage Farm Learning Center, WCCUSD Education Fund, The Latina Center, Neighborhood House of North Richmond, and Greater Richmond Interfaith Program (GRIP).

I continue to pay my full share of taxes. I continue to call for reduced military spending and increased funding for jobs programs in our community.

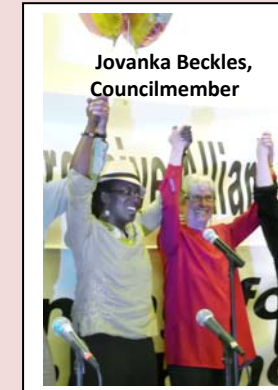

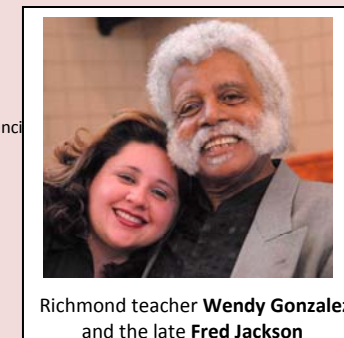

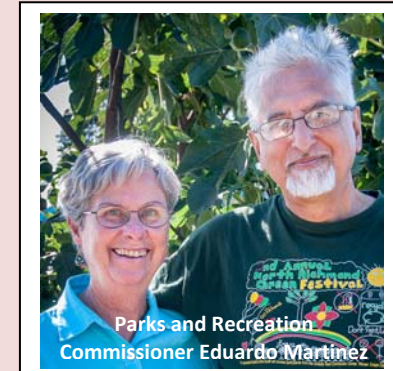
